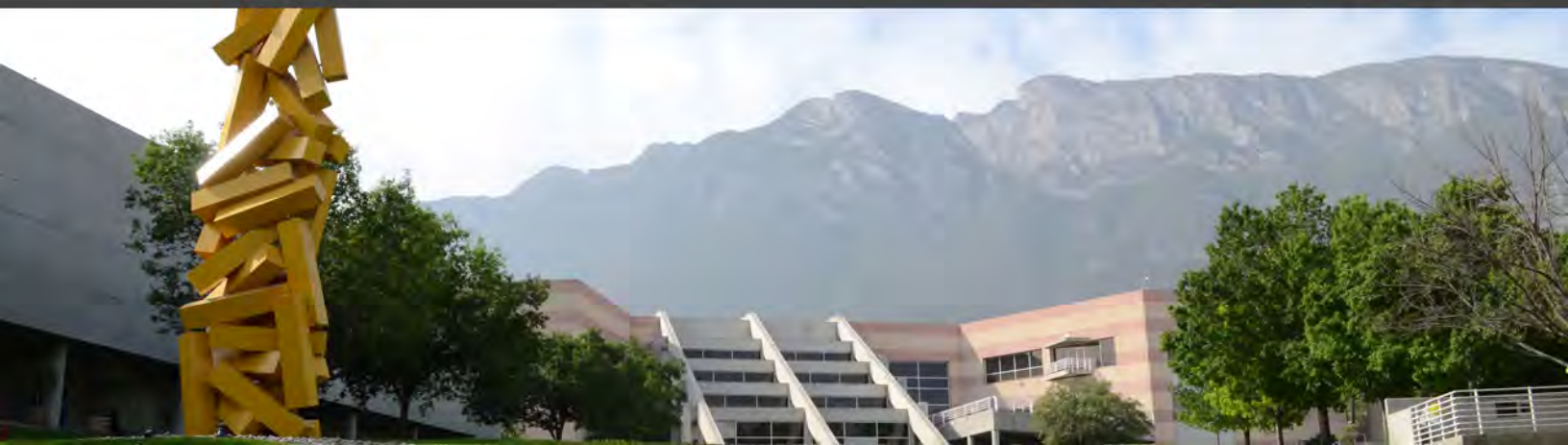

Documents to be submitted with application forms

1. Copy of passport
2. Two recommendation letters from professors
3. Copy of transcript from home university
4. Proof of health insurance coverage
(can be sent later or acquired at UDEM)

5. Course request list
6. Certificate of English level (B2)



Minimum Language Requirement

Spanish is desired, but not mandatory. If courses taught in English are chosen, students must render a certificate of English level B2.



Visa Procedures

Students from non-restricted countries, applying for one semester, do not need a student visa. Students applying for more than one semester and students from restricted countries should visit the closest Mexican Consulate or Embassy to apply for a student visa. More information [here](#).
