Language requirements	<p>NUPACE requires exchange students to be proficient in either English OR Japanese.</p> <p>Unless they attend universities where English is the language of instruction, non-native English speakers who wish to participate in the NUPACE English-language curriculum should possess one of the following scores: TOEFL iBT 79, IELTS 6.0, TOEIC 780, CEFR B2, or CET-6 450. (Students from Scandinavia, Germany, Austria, Hong Kong and Singapore are exempt from this requirement.)</p> <p>Students intending to take regular university courses instructed in Japanese must possess N1/level 1 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT), or the equivalent.</p>	
Notification of acceptance	<p>Via e-mail, after the Nagoya University screening committee convenes.</p> <p>Vis-à-vis April admission: Late January;</p> <p>Vis-à-vis September admission: Early June.</p>	
Transcript issuance	Despatched to home university approximately four to six weeks after the completion of the exchange.
